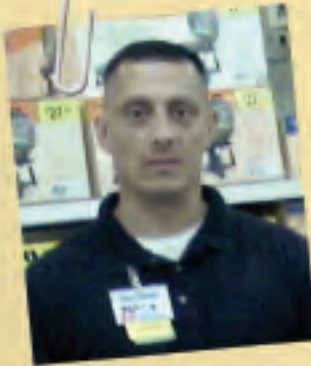


Friendly Faces at the Customer Action Network Booths

We encourage you to research your candidates and find out their views on important issues that could affect your ability to enjoy the savings and convenience that your local Wal-Mart offers.



Still haven't registered to vote?

If you're over 18, you can help to make a difference in your country and community. Register to vote **NOW** by following these simple instructions:

- There are plenty of places to register near you...
 - You may register in person, or by mail by completing a mail-in registration form and delivering it to your city or town election office.
 - Register at any local election office in any city or town in the state and at any registration event you encounter.
 - You can also register when applying for or renewing your driver's license at the Registry of Motor Vehicles or when applying for service at a designated voter registration agency.
 - Registration forms are also available at all colleges, universities, high schools and vocational schools.
- Remember: You can only register to vote in the state in which you live.
- If you are registering for the first time, please attach identification.
- If you have NOT received confirmation of your voter status from your city or town election official within 2 or 3 weeks from the date you registered, please contact your local election office to verify your voting status.
